### WHO ARE WE?

Vision in Action Cameroon (VIAC) is a youth-led not-for-profit organization that supports and enables adolescent girls and young women (AGYW) and communities in programs and influences change in the areas of Research (Evidence Generation), Advocacy (community mobilization), information & communication. VIAC is committed to feminist principles, using gender transformative and rights-based approaches.

At VIAC we believe that reproductive Health is a fundamental human right of every woman and man throughout her/his life cycle.

# HOW DO WE BENEFIT THE COMMUNITY?

Our commitment to non-discrimination allows everyone to take advantage of our initiatives and receive equitable treatment, including sex workers, who rank among the most marginalized and misunderstood demographics in our society. The skills and abilities of sex workers have been developed in the areas of safe sex negotiation, information on STI prevention, HIV, and safe abortion, along with the provision of reproductive health care needs like; condoms, contraceptives, and free HIV screening. Working with sex workers has given the team a better understanding of the difficulties they encounter and has resulted in the development of a solid community partnership where sex workers are at ease seeking information about their reproductive health.

Through our frequent educational sessions and tests, our communities are continually being informed of the WHO prevention measures for Covid 19. We organize focus group discussions with adolescent girls and young women in these rural communities to clarify misconceptions about the virus and further encourage testing and maintenance of proper hygiene. We focus our attention on those with disabilities and those in crisis-affected regions





Regarding gender-based violence, particularly intimate partner violence, VIAC has developed educational sessions, focus groups, and safe spaces in accordance with its strategic plan to increase gender equality and young people's involvement in communities. Adolescent boys and girls have participated in focus groups and workshops on gender-based violence, with a particular focus on sexual harassment, rape, positive masculinity, bullying in schools, cyberbullying, and what to do in the event of a violation.

Due to the stringent laws governing abortion in Cameroon, all forms of the practice are considered to be "unsafe." Because the majority of the population has been misinformed and is thus driven by unsafe abortion procedures, this has created a significant loophole in our community.

With young leaders, VIAC has made a conscious effort to do research, organize trainings, safe spaces for discussion, and various capacity-building workshops on access to abortion information and services.

This has further provided a distinct narrative about abortion in a society where it is forbidden, helping to reduce stigma associated with the procedure. This has empowered young girls to learn about their SRHR and make decisions that are best for them.



We help the community by working on advocacy issues. In the past two years, VIAC has explored implementation research (IR) as a strategy for instructing young adolescents, particularly girls, on various menstrual health management issues. working with six secondary schools in Cameroon's south-west VIAC has been able to alter the attitudes and behaviors of over 3,242 students across 6 schools in the South West Region of Cameroon by working with six secondary schools in that region.



Using our menstrual health management comic book titled, "Siewe the period angel," a total of 78 school champions were taught in these six secondary schools to serve as peer educators for menstrual health management. Intense follow-up has been conducted at these institutions with the assistance of focal persons to make sure that school champions in these schools are instructing their peers and transferring the leadership mantle after completing their studies at the institutions.
